The dreaded DBQ, or "document-based question," is an essay question type on the AP History exams (AP US History, AP European History, and AP World History). For the DBQ essay, you will be asked to analyze some historical issue or trend with the aid of the provided sources, or "documents," as evidence.

What is a DBQ? The Document-Based Question Explained

Section II of the AP World History exam is divided into two parts: the document-based question (DBQ) and the long-essay question. The first part of Section II is the document-based question (DBQ). This essay asks you to think like a historian; it will ask a specific question and present 4 to 10 related documents.

Document-Based Question - AP World History

You should spend approximately 15 minutes reading the documents, 5 minutes in prewriting, and 40 minutes writing your essay. The document-based question usually contains between five and seven documents. Although some of the documents will be text, others may be photo graphs, drawings, political cartoons, maps, graphs, or charts.

A document-based question (BDQ) is a means of assessment for learning. Students are tasked with analyzing documents regarding the social, economic, and political impact of globalization. The documents included are written passages, charts, political cartoons and images.

Document Based Questions World History

Whole-class discussion fundamentally transforms the traditional history classroom from one where students are passive recipients of knowledge to one where they actively produce historical knowledge.

Evidence is the historical detail, the specific facts, and examples that prove your argument. In the DBQ, your evidence comes from two places: the documents themselves, and your outside knowledge of history. You should plan to use all seven documents as evidence AND bring in your knowledge on top of that.
