The Second Sino-Japanese War was the largest Asian war in the 20th century. It accounted for the majority of civilian and military casualties in the Pacific War, with between 10 and 25 million Chinese civilians and over 4 million Chinese and Japanese military personnel missing or dying from war-related violence, famine, and other causes.

The Second Sino-Japanese War began on 7 July 1937 with the Marco Polo Bridge Incident in the Republic of China. The war, by some seen as the start of World War II, ended when the Empire of Japan surrendered to the Allies in August 1945. By the end of July 1937, fighting had escalated into a full-scale war and both countries deployed their air forces, ground troops, and warships into combat.

The military conflict became known as the "Second Sino-Japanese War" (the First Sino-Japanese War was from 1894 to 1895), or the "War of Resistance Against Japan" (抗日战争). It marked the beginning of the Second World War in the Pacific, ending only with the surrender of Japan in 1945.

With the start of the Second Sino-Japanese War in 1937, operational conditions favored the use of many small units, resulting in the creation of many independent Air Battalions (独立飞行队, Dokuritsu Hikō Daitai) or even independent squadrons (独立飞行中队, Dokuritsu Hikō Chutai), each with its own distinctive markings.
